Asphalt-rubber in highway resurfacing

More resistant to cracks and potholes, the material is also environmentally friendly



Sustainable technology was used for the resurfacing the Washington Luís Highway, SP 310. The asphalt used contains ground recycled tire rubber and is up to three times more durable than conventional asphalt.

Its elasticity slows the development of cracks and potholes, and it also offers benefits in terms of sustainability. For every kilometer of road paved with asphalt-rubber, the equivalent of a thousand waste tires are recovered from landfill. The initiative reinforces the concession's commitment to ESG practices, by reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Plastic also becomes asphalt

Among the technological initiatives to combat environmental pollution, for which Brazil ranks among the four biggest global producers of waste, a new solution has begun to be rolled out by Eixo SP. It uses recycled waste plastic in road paving, a trailblazing initiative for the country. The trial application of this sustainable technology began with a stretch of highway in Rio Claro, between km 170+650 and 171+650 towards São Carlos.

Environmental benefits of plastic

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Innovation: electric recovery vehicle

New tow truck will reduce emissions when providing breakdown services on Eixo SP highways



Electric vehicles are now a reality in Eixo SP's operational fleet. In a move to reduce the GHG emissions from our services, in February 2023 the first tow truck powered by clean energy entered into service. The vehicle is charged by a local solar plant, is more economical than a conventional diesel tow truck, and has an efficient range for the job.

The electric tow truck is part of a planned fleet of electric vehicles for user services, representing another element in Eixo SP's ESG plan: a carbonfree highway network. Plans are already in place for the provision of clean energy for electric vehicles on all 12 of the concession operator's highways. Our travel centers will soon be equipped with charging stations.

Adoption and responsible ownership

Animals found on the roadside are rescued and put up for adoption

As well as rescuing abandoned animals found along the 12 highways it operates, Eixo SP also supports cat and dog adoption initiatives, like the ones held in Brotas and Rancharia this year. This is an initiative that bears user safety in mind while helping reduce the numbers of abandoned animals.

Between June 2022 and May 2023, Eixo SP registered 573 cases involving animals on the highway network under its management. The rescued animals are mostly horses and cattle. But there are also dogs, cats, pigs and birds. After neutering and recovering from any injuries, cats and dogs are put up for adoption.

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"Planting the Future": cultivating

environmental education

Eixo SP and partners planted 2,022 native tree seedlings

To celebrate Tree Week 2022, Eixo SP planted seedlings of native tree species in seven municipalities along its highway network. The initiative marked the launch of the Plantando o Futuro (Planting the Future) program, created by the concession operator to expand environmental education in the communities, with the aim of preserving flora and fauna. Altogether, 2,022 seedlings were planted.

Eixo SP's work goes beyond the highways it operates. The company fosters local development in the municipalities where it is present. As part of our ESG policy, we sponsor the Educa Judô Brasil project in Pompeia through the federal sports incentive law. The project offers 70 places for children aged 4 to 12 to

The project uses judo as an educational tool to form and transform children's lives. Local judoka Inara Santos presided over the launch ceremony, who has represented Brazil

in international competitions. The municipality provides the venue for the classes, which are held twice a week over one year.

Training for job seekers

Another example of Eixo SP's ESG policy is the Qualificar program, designed to provide skills training for the labor market. The course, run in partnership between Eixo SP, Sebrae, and São Pedro town council, comprised four modules covering topics like professional attitude, teamwork, customer service, and regulatory standards for operational safety, focusing on working with machinery and equipment.

Road safety involves the community

Eixo SP carries out educational actions to prevent and reduce accidents



Accidents are usually the result of a combination of factors or circumstances. For that reason, Eixo SP is developing a robust Accident Reduction Program (ARP), which analyzes all accidents that occur on the road. Based on ARP data, engineering, operational, technological, enforcement and educational actions are implemented, aimed at reducing the number of accidents and their severity, i.e. how many injured and fatalities.

Educational actions include campaigns to raise awareness among road users and local communities about the importance of safe behaviors, traffic regulations and good health. Pedestrians are approached and given guidance on how to cross the highway safely. And, on stretches where large numbers of people cross the road at night, reflective vests are distributed.

Highway maintenance

Maintenance teams carried out an average of 380 assignments per day to ensure a safer, more modern highway network for users

Every day, our maintenance teams work to maintain the 12 highways operated by Eixo SP and secondary roads, a total of 1,221 km. Between June 2022 and May 2023, 138,000 assignments were carried out by 855 staff, divided into 145 teams responsible for road upkeep and safety.

Those assignments included in-depth repairs, pavement recovery, drainage system maintenance, line painting, upkeep of the highway platform, roadside cleaning, and installation of metal crash barriers, among other initiatives to modernize the road network. Carrying out this type of work is essential for road users.

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Team always on standby

Average of 438 roadside assistance events per day



The numbers are impressive! During the last concession year, our operational teams responded to 160,000 calls for assistance, from Piracicaba to Panorama. That's a daily average of 438. Always on standby, rain or shine, 24/7.

Emergency medical care was provided in 9,165 cases, tow-truck services were required in 31,530 cases, and mechanical assistance—to fix problems like an empty fuel tank, a flat tire or an electrical fault—was needed in 40,752 incidents.

And it is worth remembering that when you travel on one of the 12 highways operated by Eixo SP, there are 32 travel centers, with restrooms, water and remote support.

Highway widening to transform the Marília area

Works will be decisive for logistics in São Paulo state's Midwest, with a significant impact on mobility for the local population

Safe, modern, well-maintained roads. That is the goal of Eixo SP for its network of 12 highways and secondary roads between São Carlos, in mid-São Paulo state, and Panorama, on the border with Mato Grosso do Sul state. To that end, it implements the strategic planning and engineering actions determined at the start of the concession, which include highway widening.

At this moment, Comandante João Ribeiro de Barros Highway, SP 294 is being transformed between the municipalities of Marilia and Oriente in the Brazil'sian São Paulo state. The widening began in August last year and continues apace. In the end, the works will incorpo-

To facilitate the works and keep to the time-frame, Eixo SP has set up a base at km 462, from which machinery, tools, pipes, and asphalt are sent directly to the construction area.

The works begin in Marília and head towards Oriente. There, a bridge was taken down to make way for a new one, in line with the highway improvement and expansion works.

The widened SP 294 will have a different dynamic, including CCTV cameras and Wi-Fi access. All as part of an advanced shared roadway concept, in which traffic, including bicycles, moves safely and comfortably in its separate space.

Eixo SP won the "Best Brazilian Highway Concession Operator" award in the 2022 Biggest and Best in Transport Awards, recognizing the industrial and services sectors contributing to Brazilian economic development.

The award considered the company's management efficiency and the challenges it overcame in record time to remediate environmental damage and restore points severely hit by storms in early 2022. It also considered expansion and improvement works to Comandante João Ribeiro de Barros Highway (SP 294), and new highway widening works planned for 2023 in São Paulo state's Midwest.

Eixo SP also received the 2023 Inova Infra Award for its use of technology in the Wi-Fi network available to users of its highways and the artificial intelligence used in user assistance surveillance cameras and highway operations, such as shoulder mowing.
